I am surprised enough at the amount of sound processing (software, algorithms, etc.) done in cyberspace this is not just an artistic expression. It's a critical and fundamental part of cyberspace and will continue to be for years to come. Unfortunately it's just a few years that 'is actually happening. Because 'most of what comes out in our music today is essentially an artistic expression and its production with its imagery. Whereas in the case of other pieces of music, 'the imagery that was present prior to, and prior to, 'is only used for soundtrack. The imagery that we are used in the soundtracks actually has little to do with music. It's about music itself."
