if grimes was going to write a new cyberpop anthem it would be called GRIFIME. In 2010, one of the many people, known by the alias GRISPOP, the internet-savvy personification of American cyberculture, released the new song "grimes_grime.

Grimes was a song-and-dance hybrid in which the rapping is replaced with melodic drummers and the lyrics are alternately short and wavy, and the guitar playing is also tweaked to have a more sophisticated sound, making it more of a contemporary hybrid of pop or dub. In a 2006 interview with National Review Online, producer Jeff Koons told the magazine that "the mood of this song is what I'm going for, that it's like something that's had an effect on us in a long time."

Grimes wasn't just another pop pop album, it was also something more. In 2004, rapper and director Michael Peña revealed that GRIPS is a remix of the song "Grimes_Brin" with the title "grime_grime." The album's original title was "A little girl who can dance" (not to be confused with the sound of a Grime Girl and "grime_chuggy" in Russian), but the remix was used extensively for GRIPS and gained its own nickname, "GRUPS."
